Subject: Monthly Report – December 2016

Below is a statistical report of the Howell Police Department for the month of December, 2016:

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Officers responded to 800 calls for police service.

The Howell Police Department prides itself on a proactive rather than reactive philosophy of policing. This preventative approach is reflected in the Calls for Service in December, 2016:

- Building Checks at 163 (in which 6 were found open);
- Foot Patrols at 97;
- Assisted EMS at 74;
- Area Checks at 53;
- Citizen Assist at 49.

Further, Officers responded to:

- 48 Suspicious Activity: (30 Suspicious Situations, 13 Suspicious Vehicles and 5 Suspicious Person);
- 32 Assists to Non-Law Enforcement Agencies;
- 27 Motorists Assists;
- 19 Assist Fire Department;
- 16 Assist Law Enforcement Agencies.

Criminally, Howell Police Officers addressed:

- 11 Assault complaints;
- 6 Driving While License Suspended complaints;
- 4 Damage To Property;
- 3 Expired/No Insurance complaints;
- Violation of Controlled Substance Act – (VCSA) complaints.

**The OSSI system does not differentiate between the Assault and Battery that involved a Domestic relationship and an Assault and Battery under non-domestic circumstances.*

ARRESTS

Overall, the department executed 16 arrests. These arrests include 5 Obstructing Justice arrests, 5 Assault & Battery arrests, 2 Operating While Intoxicated arrest and 4 other arrests.

WARRANTS REQUESTED

During the month of December, the Howell Police Department submitted 35 warrant requests to the Prosecutor's Office and the City Attorney. Of the cases submitted, 27 criminal/traffic charges were obtained, which includes 23 misdemeanor offenses and 4 felony offenses. 8 cases resulted in no charges.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT/TRAFFIC CRASHES

Traffic Enforcement:

In December, Howell Police Officers completed 207 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, Howell Officers issued 135 Uniform Traffic Citations (UTC).

The top 5 citations issued are as follows:

- Speeding 1-10 over limit at 33;
- Expired License Plate at 23;
- Defective Equipment Violations at 16;
- Disobey Traffic Control Device at 12;
- No Proof of Insurance at 9.

In the month of December, Howell Officers issued 111 parking citations.

The top 5 parking citations are as follows:

- Parking on Designated Streets Over Time Limit at 35;
- Parking in Parking Lot Over Posted Time Limits at 23;
- Fire Lane at 19;
- Snow Emergency at 17;
- Parked Left to Curb at 6.

Traffic Crashes:

On the crash side, Howell Police Officers responded to a total of 26 traffic crashes, of which 20 are reportable*.

RESIDENTIAL VACATION CHECKS

During the month of December, Howell Officers conducted 155 Residential Vacation checks.

SPECIAL EVENTS

There were no Special events during the month of December.

TRAINING

During the month of December, officers attended the following training;

- On December 1st, Sgt. Dunn, and Officers Lockhart, Banfield, Burke, Charlick, Vallance and Briggs attended 2 hours of Legal Update training.
- On December 12th, Sgts Woods, Fogo and Dunn and Detective Kobel attended 3.50 hours of Child Abuse Investigation training.

- On December 14th, Officers Burke, Charlick, Vallance and Briggs attended 8 hours of Emotional Survival training.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Detective Bureau is currently assigned 8 active investigations. During the month, the Detective closed 3 of the investigations. The three closed investigations were: one (1) Embezzlement investigation, one (1) Check Fraud investigation, and one (1) Suspicious Situation investigation.

LAWNET

The LAWNET Officer reported the following seizures:

- 22.19 pounds of Marijuana;
- 19 pounds of Marijuana Medibles;
- 8.7 pounds of Marijuana Butter;
- 8.5 pounds of Marijuana Dough;
- 6.6 pounds of TCH Vials(260 Vials);
- 2.3 pounds of Marijuana Oil;
- 1.4 pounds of Marijuana Wax;
- 58.6 grams of Heroin;
- 43.2 grams of Cocaine;
- 28 grams of Marijuana Powder;
- 9 doses of Hydrocodone.

Additionally, 8 investigations were initiated and 3 arrests were executed.

Events of Interest:

- On December 6th, Howell Officers were dispatched to the Holiday Mobil Gas Station for a report of a Retail Fraud that had just occurred. Officers were able to locate the suspect in the Kensington Inn. The suspect was in possession of stolen alcohol. Also in his room (in plain view) were narcotics that were seized. The suspect is a known criminal and known for theft and larceny. He was lodged at the Livingston County jail.
- On December 22nd, LAWNET officers assisted the Livingston County Probation Department and the City of Howell Police Department with a subject found to be in possession of Heroin paraphernalia. A search of the subject's bedroom revealed Steroids and an unknown type of pill. The subject was turned over to the Livingston County Probation Department.
- On December 23rd, Howell Officers were dispatched to assist EMS with a trouble breathing complaint that turned into a Death Investigation. Officers were advised the deceased had complained of trouble breathing for a couple of days. The subjects roommates found him struggling to breath and the subject went into cardiac arrest. It was determined he has previous heart/medical conditions. The subject was pronounced dead at the residence and the Medical Examiner was contacted. There was nothing suspicious found during the investigation. An autopsy was completed, results pending.
- On December 23rd, Howell Officers responded with Livingston County EMS for a drug overdose. The caller was a mother reporting her 22 year old son had overdosed on suspected heroin. Upon

arrival the son was breathing however he was unconscious. EMS administered treatment and was able wake the son up. He was then transported to the hospital by EMS. No illegal drugs related to the overdose were found inside the home. Officers later spoke with the son who admitted he had used heroin.
