Subject: Monthly Report – March 2018

Below is a statistical report of the Howell Police Department for the month of March, 2018:

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Officers responded to 835 calls for police service.

The Howell Police Department prides itself on a proactive rather than reactive philosophy of policing. This preventative approach is reflected in the Calls For Service in March, 2018:

- Building Check at 174 (in which 7 were found open);
- Foot Patrol at 83;
- Assist EMS at 78;
- Citizen Assist at 50;
- Area Checks at 48.

Further, Officers responded to:

- Assist Non – Law Enforcement Agencies at 48;
- Suspicious Activity at 43 (20 Suspicious Situations, 12 Suspicious Vehicles and 11 Suspicious Persons);
- Assist Fire at 31;
- Motorist Assist at 21;
- Civil Matter Disputes – Family Trouble at 16.

Criminally, Howell Police Officers handled:

- 8 Assault complaints;
- 7 Driving While License Suspended complaints;
- 5 Larceny Complaints (1 larceny of personal property from motor vehicle, 1 larceny of Gas , 1 larceny from grounds and 2 Larceny Other.);
- 5 Expired/No Insurance;
- 5 Operating Under the Influence of Liquor or Drugs.

**The OSSI system does not differentiate between the Assault and Battery that involved a Domestic relationship and an Assault and Battery under non-domestic circumstances.*

ARRESTS

Overall, the department executed 19 physical arrests. These include 6 Operating While Intoxicated arrests, 5 Obstructing Justice arrests, 2 Assault and Battery arrests, 2 Burglary – No Forced Entry – Residence arrest, 1 Motor Vehicle Theft arrest and 3 other arrests.

WARRANTS REQUESTED

During the month of March, the Howell Police Department submitted 81 warrant requests to the Prosecutor’s Office and the City Attorney. Of the cases submitted, 70 criminal/traffic charges were obtained, which includes 55 misdemeanor offenses and 15 felony offenses. 11 resulted in no charges.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT/TRAFFIC CRASHES

Traffic Enforcement:

In March, Howell Police Officers completed 214 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, Howell Officers issued a total of 123 Uniform Traffic Citations (UTC).

The top 5 citations issued are as follows:

- Speeding at 49;
- Expired License Plate at 24;
- Disobey Traffic Control Device at 13;
- Fail to Stop in Assured Clear Distance at 7;
- Operate Without Insurance at 5.

In the month of March Howell Officers issued 111 parking citations.

Traffic Crashes:

On the crash side, Howell Police Officers responded to a total of 30 traffic crashes, of which 21 are reportable*.

RESIDENTIAL VACATION CHECKS

During the month of March, Howell Officers conducted 474 Residential Vacation checks.

TRAINING

On March 14th, Officers Charlick and Sawyer attended Crime Prevention for Businesses training.

On March 16th, All sworn officers attended Range training.

SPECIAL EVENTS

There were no special events to report on for the month of March, 2018.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

During the month of January, the SRO responded to 12 calls for police service, authored 3 criminal reports and 9 non-criminal reports. In addition to the above reports, the SRO delivered several presentations to students, participated in the "why you matter" program that was coordinated by the High School Student Leadership Team. The SRO also conducted Shelter in Place drills at the Freshman Campus and Highlander Way Middle School.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Detective Bureau is currently assigned 11 active investigations. During the month, the Detective was able to close six (6) investigations. Two (2) Suspicious Situation investigations were closed. One (1)

Larceny investigation was closed. One (1) Embezzlement investigation was closed. One (1) Death investigation was closed and one (1) Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) investigation was closed.

LAWNET

The LAWNET Officer reported the following seizures:

- 80 doses of Hydrocodone;
- 38 doses of LCD;
- 14 doses of MDMA (MOLLY);
- 4.4 ounces of Marijuana Medibles;
- 1.65 ounces of Marijuana;
- 1.4 ounces of Marijuana Oil;
- 12 grams of Marijuana Wax;
- 8 grams of Psilocybin Mushrooms;
- 6.9 grams of Marijuana Hash;
- 3 grams of Crack Cocaine;
- .04 grams of Heroin.

Additionally, 12 investigations were initiated and 4 arrests were executed.

EVENTS OF INTEREST:

- On March 3rd, Officers were dispatched for a report of a male that had been bothering people in the Central Business District. Upon contact with the subject, the officers found that the subject was intoxicated and that he had been drinking at a local bar. The subject was not fully cooperative with officers but it was discovered that he had a warrant out for his arrest. The subject was lodged at the Livingston County Jail on the warrant.
- On March 4th, Officers were dispatched to an Assist EMS complaint regarding a subject that was in cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, it was determined that the incident was likely a drug overdose due to the scene. EMS, Fire, and Police personnel worked on the patient for a period of time until all attempts to revive the subject were exhausted. A death investigation was conducted and it was determined to be a drug overdose. LAWNET was notified of details discovered during the investigation.
- On March 10th, Howell Officers were advised of a subject that was on parole and was in Howell City and intoxicated. Officers were advised the subject may try and run if he is found. Officers located the subject near Byron Rd and Spring St. The subject had been drinking. Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC) was contacted and they requested he be arrested for Parole Violation. The male subject was lodged at the Livingston County Jail for the violation.
- On March 15th, officers were advised of a possible intoxicated driver westbound on M-59 from Byron Rd. Dispatch advised that they had a subject following the driver. A few minutes later they stated that the subject drove off the road into a drainage ditch on the Howell High School service drive. Officers arrived and found the driver outside the vehicle sitting in several inches of water. The subject, a 59 year old white female, failed sobriety tests and was given a Preliminary

Breath Test with the result of .160. She was arrested and lodged at the Livingston County Jail for Operating While Intoxicated.

- On March 20th, Howell Officers were dispatched to the Kensington Inn for two males that had overdosed on drugs. Both subjects were treated on scene by EMS and transported to the hospital. Both subjects were on parole through Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC). MDOC was contacted and requested the subjects be arrested once they cleared the hospital. Once both subjects were treated and cleared from the hospital, they were both arrested and lodged at the Livingston County Jail.
