Subject: Monthly Report (Public) – September 2014

Below is a statistical report of the Howell Police Department for the month of September, 2014:

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Officers responded to 813 calls for police service.

The Howell Police Department prides itself on a proactive rather than reactive philosophy of policing. This preventative approach is reflected in the Calls for Service in September, 2014:

- Building Check at 121 (in which 14 were found open);
- Foot Patrols 93
- Assisted EMS 69;
- Citizen Assist 62;
- Suspicious Activity 56 times: (42 Suspicious Situations, 9 Suspicious Vehicles, and 5 Suspicious Persons)

Further, Officers responded to:

- 41 Area Checks
- 28 Motorists Assists;
- 25 False Alarms;
- 21 Assists to Non-Law Enforcement Agencies;
- 19 Parking Violations

Criminally, Howell Police Officers addressed:

- 12 Larceny Complaints (10 Larceny from Building, 1 Larceny of motor vehicle parts, and 1 Larceny of personal Property)
- 9 Assault complaints;
- 7 Intimidation/Stalking Complaints
- 6 Warrant Arrests;
- 6 Driving While License Suspended complaints;

**The OSSI system does not differentiate between the Assault and Battery that involved a Domestic relationship and an Assault and Battery under non-domestic circumstances.*

ARRESTS

Overall, the department executed 34 physical arrests. These arrests include 11 Obstructing Justice Arrests, 7 Assault and Battery Arrests, 6 Operating While Intoxicated Arrests, 6 Driving on Suspended License and 4 other arrests.

WARRANTS REQUESTED

During the month of September, the Howell Police Department submitted 45 warrant requests to the Prosecutor’s Office and the City Attorney. Of the cases submitted, 37 criminal/traffic charges were obtained, which includes 27 misdemeanor offenses and 10 felony offenses. Seven (8) cases resulted in no charges.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT/TRAFFIC CRASHES

Traffic Enforcement:

In September, Howell Police Officers completed 204 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, Howell Officers issued a total of 152 Uniform Traffic Citations (UTC).

The top 5 citations issued are as follows:

- Speeding 1-10 over limit at 38;
- Defective Equipment Violations at 16
- Expired License Plate at 16;
- No Proof of Insurance at 14;
- Drove While License Suspended/Denied, Revoked at 7

In the month of September, Howell Officers issued 107 parking citations.

Traffic Crashes:

On the crash side, Howell Police Officers responded to a total of 28 traffic crashes, of which 18 are reportable*.

RESIDENTIAL VACATION CHECKS

During the month of September, Howell Officers conducted 104 Residential Vacation checks.

SPECIAL EVENTS

There were no special events in September.

TRAINING

During the month of September, officers attended the following training;

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Detective Bureau is currently assigned 14 active investigations. During the month, the Detective closed eleven (6) of the investigations. The eleven closed investigations were: three (2) Criminal Sexual Conduct investigations; one (1) Larceny Investigation; one (1) Threats / Intimidation Investigation; and one (1) Found Property Investigation.

LAWNET

The LAWNET Officer reported a productive month with the following substantial seizures:

- 54.9 grams of Marijuana;
- 65.3 grams of Marijuana Edibles;
- 36.0 grams of Marijuana Lotion;
- 20.8 grams of Hashish;
- 5 Marijuana plants;
- 400 Pills / Doses of Methadone;
- 120 Pills / Doses of Norco;
- 20 Pills / Doses of Vicodin
- 10 Doses of LSD
- 2 Pills / Doses of Suboxone

Additionally, 9 investigations were initiated and 11 arrests were executed.

Events of Interest:

- On September 16^h, LAWNET officers conducted a warrant attempt at a residence in the Howell City area. During the attempt, consent to search was denied but enough probable cause existed to seek a Search Warrant. LAWNET officers established a perimeter on the residence and a Search Warrant was sought. While waiting for the judge to sign the warrant, the suspect was taken into custody by officers on scene after he finally surrendered. The suspect refused to come out of the residence for nearly an hour which led to officers seeking the Search Warrant. The suspect was wanted for a Felony CSC 1 offense out of the Livingston County Sheriff's Department. The suspect's father was also arrested for Harboring a Fugitive. Both were lodged at the Livingston County Jail with the assistance of the Howell Police Department.

LAWNET officers made an arrest on a subject at a residence in the Howell City area. The suspect came out of the residence during the above incident where LAWNET officers were securing the perimeter for a wanted fugitive. The female suspect was found to have 2 warrants for her arrest out of Genesee County. She was arrested and found to be in possession of Suboxone without a prescription. The female was lodged at the Livingston County Jail for Genesee County to pickup with the assistance of the Howell Police Department.

- On September 17th, LAWNET officers conducted surveillance on a target in the Howell City area. This is follow up to credible tips that the location is the residence of a prescription pill dealer.
- On September 19th, a subject wanted on a LAWNET Felony Warrant for Delivery of Marijuana that took place between Howell City and Fowlerville turned himself in after attempts to arrest him were made at his Howell Twp. residence by LAWNET officers.
