The Livingston County Veterans Memorial Beautification Project needs your support

Built in the 1940s, the Livingston County Veterans Memorial lists the names of the veterans from Livingston County who gave their lives in WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Located on the lawn of the historic Livingston County Courthouse on Grand River Avenue in downtown Howell, the memorial is also the site of ceremonies on Memorial Day, Flag Day, and Veterans Day.

After honoring veterans so well for 60 years, the memorial is in need of repair and enhancement. Plans are in place to enlarge the memorial area and add seating, lighting and landscaping to create a more visible, easily accessible tribute to our veterans.

The cost of the entire project is approximately \$40,000. The goal is to have it installed by the end of summer.


Your donation will help this important project pay tribute to those who served. This project is already receiving strong community support, with donations from veterans organizations, as well as key businesses in the community.
