Subject: Monthly Report – March 2014

Below is a statistical report of the Howell Police Department for the month of March, 2014:

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Officers responded to 736 calls for police service versus 802 in March, 2013.

The Howell Police Department prides itself on a proactive rather than reactive philosophy of policing. This preventative approach is reflected in the Calls For Service in March, 2014:

- Assist EMS 82;
- Citizen Assist 73;
- Building Check at 70 (in which 10 were found open);
- Foot Patrol 70;
- Area Check 56;

Further, Officers:

- Documented 49 reports of Suspicious Activity (28 Suspicious Situations, 12 Suspicious Persons and 9 Suspicious Vehicles);
- Conducted 23 Liquor Inspections;
- Motorist Assist 21;
- Investigated 28 Traffic Crashes (19 PDA Traffic Area, 6 PDA Non-traffic Area and 3 Hit and Run)
- Assisted Non-Law Enforcement Agencies 16 times;

Criminally, Howell Police Officers addressed:

- 10 Assault complaints *(8 Assault and Battery and 2 Aggravated Assault);
- 9 Larceny complaints (3 Larceny of Gasoline, 5 Larceny from Building and 1 Larceny from Motor Vehicle);
- 6 Fraud complaints (1 Fraud-Credit Card, 3 Fraud by False Pretense, 1 Fraud – Impersonation and 1 Fraud Non Sufficient Funds);
- 4 Damage to Property complaints;
- 3 Violation of Controlled Substance Act complaints.

**The OSSI system does not differentiate between the Assault and Battery that involved a Domestic relationship and an Assault and Battery under non-domestic circumstances.*

ARRESTS

Overall, the department executed 27 physical arrests. These arrests include 18 Warrant Arrests, 3 Assault and Battery arrests, 1 Aggravated Assault arrests; 1 Violation of Controlled Substances.

For MICR reporting purposes, 4 arrest records were entered into OSSI/RMS as a result of a warrant obtained and the suspect was not taken into custody. See attached for additional information.

WARRANTS REQUESTED

During the month of March, the Howell Police Department submitted 54 warrant requests to the Prosecutor’s Office and the City Attorney. Of the cases submitted, 41 criminal/traffic charges were obtained, which includes 28 misdemeanor offenses and 13 felony offenses. 13 charges were denied.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT/TRAFFIC CRASHES

Traffic Enforcement:

In March, Howell Police Officers completed 180 traffic stops. Of those traffic stops, Howell Officers issued a total of 153 Uniform Traffic Citations.

The top 5 citations issued are as follows:

- Speeding 1-10 over limit at 27;
- Expired License Plate at 23;
- Defective Headlight at 19;
- No Proof Insurance at 17;
- Disobey Traffic Control Device 9.

In the month of March Howell Officers issued 76 parking citations.

Traffic Crashes:

On the crash side, Howell Police Officers responded to a total of 28 traffic crashes, of which 21 are reportable*.

RESIDENTIAL VACATION CHECKS

During the month of March, Howell Officers conducted 429 Residential Vacation checks.

SPECIAL EVENTS

There were no special events to report on for the month of March, 2014.

TRAINING

During March, 2014, Officers attended the following training:

- On March 4, Sergeants Woods, Mannor and Kelleher, and Officers Banfield, Spyke and Kobel completed an 8 hour block of training that covered CPR, First Aid and PPCT. On March 5, Officers Lockhart, Mitts, Small, Fogo, Miller, Dunn and Lorenz completed the same 8 hour block of training that covered CPR, First Aid and PPCT. The PPCT portion of this training was conducted by HPD Officers. The First Aid/CPR portion was conducted by Howell Area Fire Department personnel.
- On March 13, 14 and 15 Howell Officers attended a county wide "Active Shooter" training course. This was attended by all Police, Fire and EMS Departments within Livingston County.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Detective Bureau is currently assigned 11 active investigations. During the month, the Detective was able to close two (2) open death investigations as accidental overdoses. This was based on autopsy results from the Medical Examiner. The Detective was also able to close one open Structure Fire Investigation as an accidental fire after receiving information from ATF.

LAWNET

The LAWNET Officer reported a productive month with the following substantial seizures:

- 12,668.4 grams, or 29.48 pounds of Marijuana;
- 724.2 grams or 1.59 lbs of Marijuana Butter
- 89 miscellaneous pharmaceutical narcotics (Hydorcodine, Xanax, Clonazepam, Morphine);
- 22 Marijuana Plants;
- 14.6 grams of Methamphetamine Oil;
- 4.1 gram of Heroin
- 3.2 grams of Crack Cocaine
- .5 grams of Methamphetamine

Additionally, 11 investigations were initiated and 4 arrests were executed.

Events of Interest:

- On March 13th, LAWNET officers conducted a Felony Warrant Arrest in the City of Howell. The warrant was for delivery of morphine and other Schedule 4 narcotics to a confidential informant.
- On March 20th, LAWNET officers assisted Howell Officers at the scene of a heroin overdose. LAWNET Officers obtained consent to search the residence and located several different types of narcotics. Estimated value of the narcotics was over \$1,300.00. Howell Officers arrested one subject on an outstanding warrant while a second subject was transported to St. Joseph of Livingston Hospital for treatment.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

During the month March, the School Resource Officer responded to 29 calls for police service, which included 19 non-criminal, 9 criminal reports and 1 status offense. 8 criminal charges were obtained.
